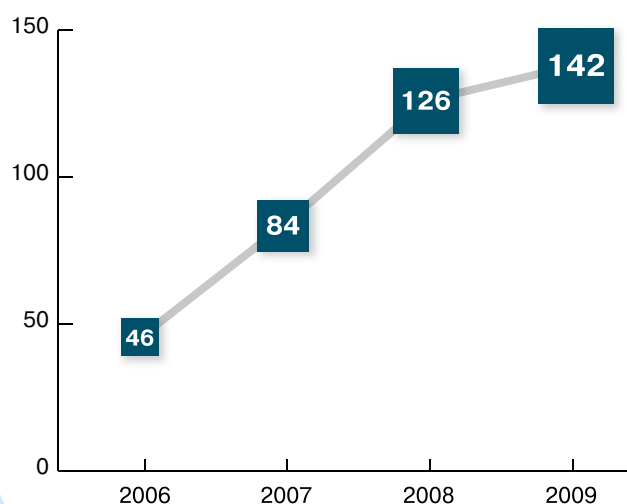

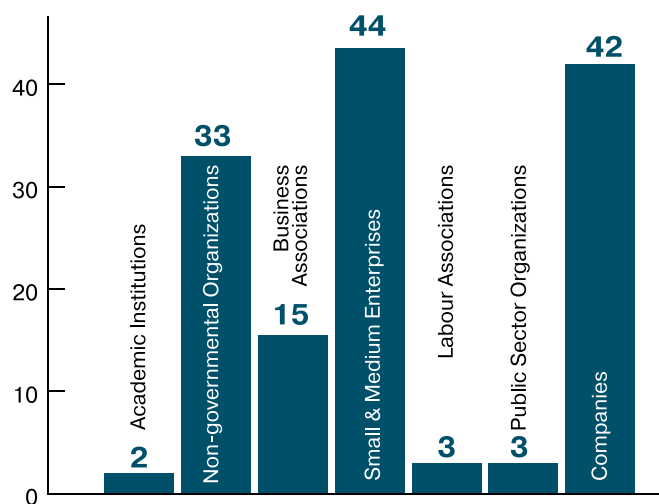

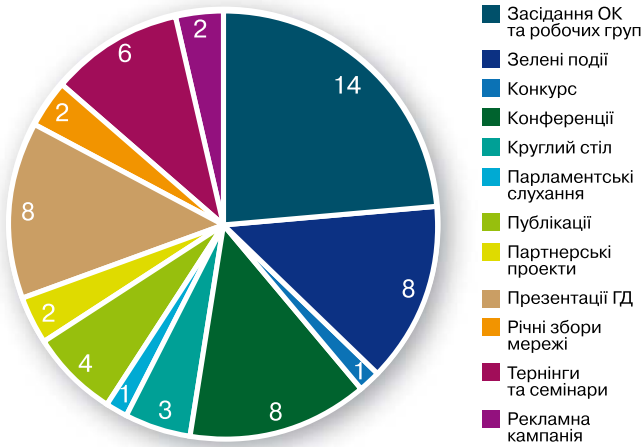
Number of Global Compact members in 2006-2009

GLOBAL COMPACT NETWORK'S GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

The Ukrainian Global Compact Network

The Ukrainian Global Compact (GC) Network is an assembly of signatories, including companies, business associations, trade unions, employers' organizations, non-governmental and civil society organizations and academic institutions, who support GC principles in the areas of human rights, labour standards, environment, anti-corruption and pledge to integrate them into their daily activities.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Ukrainian GC Network is to promote the Global Compact and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) concept in Ukraine; to monitor the progress of its members

with respect to implementation of the ten GC principles through learning, dialogue and partnership.

Governance Structure

The Ukrainian GC network has a semi-formal organizational structure which consists of a Steering Committee (SC) elected among the GC signatories to govern the network, and a Secretariat which provides administrative and organizational support to the network's activities. The United Nations office in Ukraine acted as GC Secretariat in 2009.

GC network members can start the thematic working group for implementation of joint initiatives on specific CSR issues. In 2009 there were active six working groups on:

GLOBAL COMPACT NETWORK DEVELOPMENT IN UKRAINE

The Global Compact regional launch in Crimea



Simferopol became the 6th city where next regional launch of the GC network in Ukraine was held. The main goal was to present the GC initiative to Crimean companies as the world's largest CSR initiative, and to discuss successful examples of companies guided by principles of social responsibility in its business practices. More than 50 representatives of Crimean enterprises, NGOs and media participated at the event. The event was organized in partnership with the Crimean Ministry of Economy and the Crimean Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

BEST PRACTICES FROM GC MEMBERS

"KyivStar" presentation of the Global Compact Initiative to its partners

Popularization of GC – this is a priority task not only for Steering Committee and Secretariat, but also for each GC member. For example, KyivStar Company held a presentation on GC initiative at its annual conference of KyivStar's partners (27 January) to promote business based on 10 principles of responsible corporate citizenship to its suppliers, dealers, distributors and banks that work closely with KyivStar. About 80 Ukrainian companies attended the event.

Workshop "Implementing Global Compact Principles Using Global Leaders Network Model"

The seminar brought together members of the GC network and companies interested in joining the GC initiative. Participants were briefed on the GC general principles and a global leadership network model as a useful implementation instrument of GC principles. The guest speaker was Aris Vrettos, Senior Advisor from AccountAbility. Company representatives went through from a mental conceptualization of the business to identifying priority areas to sustainable development, working on strategies and mechanisms for its implementation, and selecting indicators to measure progress.

First academic institution joined Global Compact

It is hard to overestimate the role of academic and scientific circles in the development of the CSR idea. Through research activities and educational materials, this sector can significantly improve the understanding of CSR and specific ways of its implementation. In 2009, two higher education institutions, namely the Ukrainian Catholic University and the International Management Institute, joined the GC network in Ukraine. Congratulations!

Business to business meeting on social reporting



The constant exchange of experiences and best practices among members of the GC is an integral feature of the Ukrainian network. B2B meetings («business to business»), when the company initiates this exchange, is the most effective way of sharing thoughts, ideas, experiences. On 12th of March two GC members, Coca-Cola Ukraine and System Capital Management, held B2B meeting devoted to the experience of preparing social reports and analysis of the challenges and benefits of non-financial reporting.

International online conference "Corporate Social Responsibility – a bridge to your consumers"

From 27 to 30 October the internet conference was held at the Consumer Portal (www.consumerinfo.org.ua). It was organized by the Charity fund "Center of Consumer

Initiatives” with support of the Global Compact Network. Over four days, more than 3,000 views of the conference materials were registered.

A section dedicated to organizing the review and handling of consumers’ appeals that was moderated by Dr. Kristian Torun, Advisor on Trade and Economic Policy Issues of the Federation of Consumer Organizations in Germany, Ms. Natalia Korsunska, Deputy Head of the Charity fund “Center of Consumer Initiatives”, and Ms. Evgeniya Kuchmar, Head of the contact center of the “Foxtrot” Group of Companies, attracted the most attention. Issues related to building honest and responsible marketing communications with consumers were also vividly discussed. The relevant section was moderated by Dr. Arnd Khardtke, Head of the Committee “Reporting on Sustainable Development” of the German Association of Environment Experts, and Ms. Natalia Fesun, Director for External Relations of the «Bel Group» company. The questions related to product quality, were answered by Dr. Peter Zieber, Ex-Head of the Research Department of the consumer organization “Stiftung Warentest” and Mr. Andriy Kren’, Head of Public Relations Department of the “Vitmark” company.

BEST PRACTICES FROM GC MEMBERS

The III International conference “Corporate Social Responsibility. Global Challenges and National Solutions”

For the third consecutive year a member of the Ukrainian GC network, business magazine «Expert Ukraine», is holding the only in Ukraine international conference on CSR. Traditionally, the Global Compact initiative provides expertise, analytical and informational assistance in organizing the event. In 2009, the GC network has also become a partner in presentation of the book “Conversations with Disbelievers” by John Weiser and Simon Zadek

Annual meeting of the Global Compact network in Ukraine

Every year members of the GC network in Ukraine participate in a general assembly to discuss the previous year activities and to develop a plan for the next year.

In 2009 a special guest of the meeting was the Permanent Representative of IMF in Ukraine Max Alier. Summarizing the results of the network activity at the annual meeting that was held on 16 December signatories noted that in 2009 the network has led in promoting such important topics as environmental protection and climate change, developing a national strategy on CSR and dialogue with the media. Among the priorities for next year, participants decided to continue a tradition of holding Business Summit on Climate Change, support the Parliamentary Committee on Industrial and Regulatory Policy and Entrepreneurship in developing the National Strategy of CSR promotion in Ukraine, as well as to encourage fruitful cooperation with the Ukraine Ministry of Education and Science to incorporate CSR in the curricula of Ukrainian universities. ●

LABOUR STANDARDS AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION – 2009 DEVELOPMENT PRIORITIES OF THE NETWORK

LABOUR STANDARDS:

Training on corporate volunteering



During the training that was supported by the Federation of Employers of Ukraine participants were familiarized with the theory and practice of corporate volunteerism as a component of corporate social responsibility. They also shared ideas about implementing strategies of volunteering programs in their companies and organizations.

Seminar on labour disputes



The economic crisis of 2009 has coined additional pressure on the relationship between employer and employee, making the subject of labour disputes and means of addressing them very pertinent. On September 17 by the GC working group on labour standards organized a seminar during which participants not only reviewed typical examples of collective labour disputes in Ukraine, the nature of their origin and possible solutions, but also got valuable advice on how to act in dispute situations from the experts of International Labour Organization (ILO) and the National Mediation and Reconciliation Agency (NMRA).

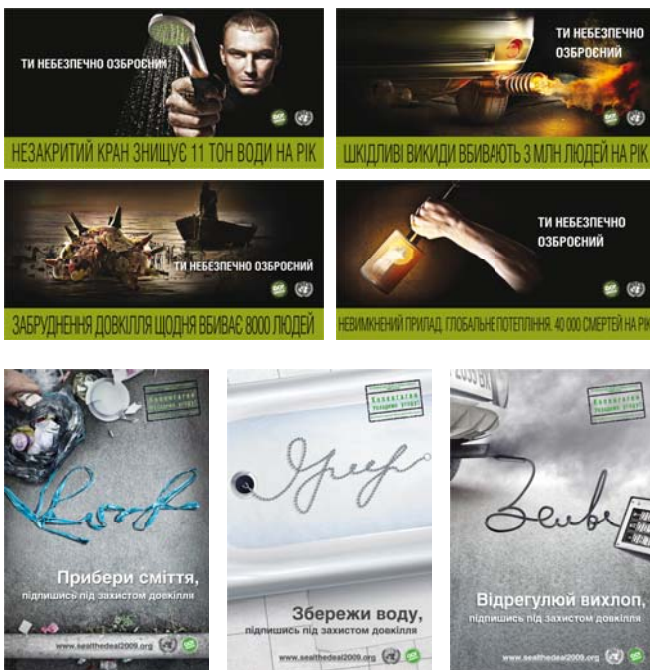
ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION:

The two largest in Ukraine environmental social campaigns «You are Dangerously Armed!» and «Seal the Deal!»

The purpose of the advertising campaigns with environmental perspective, which was initiated by UN and GC network in Ukraine within the national initiative GO GREEN!, was to draw attention to environmental problems in Ukraine and to promote positive change in the attitude of the Ukrainians to the environment.

The first campaign was titled «You Are Dangerously Armed!» and drew attention to natural resources conservation in daily life.

Just before the summit in Copenhagen since October 2009 the second wave under the slogan «Seal the Deal!» has started. This campaign had a purpose to increase awareness among Ukrainians about the necessity of a signed climate agreement in Copenhagen and appealed to each person to make a contribution to environmental protection by acting responsibly.



Both campaigns were highly appreciated at the National Festival of Social Advertising (December 10-11). The environmental social advertising campaign “You Are Dangerously Armed” won the first prize in the category “Social Advertising of Non-Governmental Organizations”. The “Seal the Deal” campaign was also awarded with a Festival diploma.

The creative idea for the first campaign was developed pro bono by the agency «Young & Rubicam», and the second one by «Tabasco». The company «BigBoard» placed ads on about 1000 of their billboards at no charge too.

1st Ukrainian Business Summit «Climate Change: Perceptions and Readiness for Action»



Summit organized with the support of the Ministry of Environment of Ukraine, became the unique multilateral platform for discussion about the role of business in climate change mitigation, new innovative business-models for environment protection, state facilitation of ecological responsibility of business, the necessity of public-private partnerships and importance of eco-friendly technologies and energy efficiency. The event was attended by more than 150 participants representing government, business, the expert community and NGOs.

National Survey on Climate Change Perceptions in Ukraine

This all-Ukrainian survey was conducted in 2009 and analyzes climate change perceptions among businesses, general public and expert community, and the level of support and readiness to tackle the issue. It is based on more than one thousand individual interviews conducted in 24 regions of Ukraine and the Autonomous Republic of the Crimea. In addition, 500 companies representing various industrial sectors of Ukraine and over 30 experts of governmental and non-governmental institutions made their contributions, thus providing a comprehensive picture of climate change awareness within Ukraine. Survey results were presented and discussed during the 1st Ukrainian Business Summit on Climate Change (March 2009). The survey was financed by “System Capital Management” and “Coca-Cola Ukraine”.



Climate Week in Ukraine

GC Network has joined the Global Week of Climate initiating its own Climate Week in Ukraine, during which from 18 to 26 September the following activities with environmental prospective took place:

- Press-conference on the environmental campaign "Seal the Deal!";
- Car Free Day;
- Sign the Petition Day: day of signing the online petition to encourage public support for future post-Copenhagen agreement;
- Presentation of the brochure «Green Office: Taking Care of the Environment, Bringing Profit to the Business»;
- «Wear Green Day» – day of symbolic demonstration of the eco-spirit by wearing something green on this day;
- Zelena Toloka «Bought a car? - Plant a Tree!»



«Green Office»

«Green Office» is a management concept that helps to decrease negative environmental impact by maximizing energy efficiency and the conservation of resources to reduce waste in the office. The GC network members learned about the basic principles of «Green Office» and methods of its implementation in the business organizations at the training: «Using the principles of Green Office in the organization», which was held on February 26, in the «green room» of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy. And in autumn "Green office" leaders of "Volia", "Galnaftogas", "Obolon", "Foxtrot" companies – shared their best practices at the presentation of Brochure «Green Office: Taking Care of the Environment, Bringing Profit to the Business».

Brochure «Green Office: Taking Care of the Environment, Bringing Profit to the Business»

The brochure has been developed with the support of the NASK "Oranta" company with the aim to promote Green Office practices among the Ukrainian business. The brochure includes practical hints and descriptions of the best cases of Green Office in Ukraine and worldwide. The brochure comprehensively informs about Green Office advantages and provides guidelines for its implementation.



Zelena Toloka, GO GREEN! Campaign corporate clean-up event

2009 was marked by two large clean-up events. In spring on the International Earth Day companies - signatories to GC and the folk festival «Kraina mriy» came together on the big «Green Toloka» and took part in cleaning up Trukhaniv Island in Kyiv. Toloka was attended by over 350 participants who gathered an incredible amount of garbage - eight (!) tons. At the end of the event Toloka's participants were entertained by the ethnic group «HuljajHorod» which really energized the tired activists. Yarylo brand of Coca-Cola presented the entertainment program and the delicious drink - kvas. Environmental action partners provided the necessary tools: Tetra Pak gave gloves and bags for garbage collection, and Grinko took away the collected garbage for further recycling and disposal.



And in autumn, the GC network got together again for the green Toloka «Bought a car? - Plant a Tree!» in Kiev park "Pozniaky". This Toloka brought together Ukrainian offices of leading automotive companies - Nissan Motor Ukraine, Niko and Toyota Ukraine – and a charitable fund "Ukraine! I am for you". 100 participants planted 300 trees. ●

NATIONAL POLICY DIALOGUE

In 2009, priority topics of the national dialogue included: 1) introduction of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) to the curriculum of higher education institutions in Ukraine, 2) development of a national CSR concept, 3) involvement of the mass media in the CSR debate

Round table «Practical and Theoretical Aspects of Teaching Social Responsibility of Business in Ukrainian Academia»

The round table was held with support of the Ministry of Science and Education of Ukraine (MSE) and Global Compact Network in Ukraine and was attended by more



than 20 deans of leading economic faculties and heads of university departments. During the debate the results of the research “Practice of teaching corporate social responsibility in Ukrainian universities” were presented and the possibility of introducing a course on CSR into curricula, its potential length and the role of business in its development were discussed. Special guest of the round table was dean of the St. Petersburg State University Graduate School of Management, Prof. V. Katkalo shared the experience of implementing the CSR course at his school. As a result of the discussion, participants decided to address to the MSE with the request to initiate the process of CSR course development in Ukraine.

Working group on the development of materials for educational courses on social responsibility

With the purpose of bringing up a new generation of Ukrainian business leaders and a socially responsible business culture in Ukraine, a working group was established

by the MSE to develop the draft of the CSR syllabus. The group was formed upon request of the United Nations Representative Office and Global Compact Initiative in Ukraine and according to the order of the Minister of Science and Education of Ukraine, Mr. I. Vakarchuk, dated May 21, 2009. The working group included leading representatives from academia, the MSE, business and community.

Parliamentary Committee’s hearing on corporate social responsibility in Ukraine



The Global Compact Network initiated for the hearing at the Parliamentary Committee on Industrial and Regulatory Policy and Entrepreneurship on the topic “Social Responsibility of Business: Ukrainian realities and prospects”. During the hearing Thomas Dodd (Directorate of Industry and Enterprise, European Commission) shared the European practice of public policy in CSR. Representatives of companies – GC signatories such as Adlai Goldberg (Ernst & Young), Jock Mendoza-Wilson (SCM), Alexei Miroshnichenko (Confederation of Employers of Ukraine) shared their own understanding of the achievements, challenges and prospects of CSR in Ukraine. The hearing participants – people’s deputies of Ukraine, representatives from the government, international organizations and diplomatic corps, Ukrainian companies and international companies working in Ukraine – reached a common understanding that engaging a vast business potential through CSR mechanisms will contribute to the achievement of national development goals – poverty reduction, sustainable employment, enhanced effectiveness of the use of energy resources and protection of the environment, enhanced national competitiveness, favoring effective management and fight against corruption, etc. The participants suggested establishing a Multi-stakeholder Advisory Council on the elaboration of a National Strategy of CSR promotion in Ukraine.

Workshop «CSR: Paving the Road to Ukrainian Universities»

More than 30 academics and lecturers from leading Ukrainian universities participated in the CSR workshop. The participants analyzed main notions of CSR and discussed the elaboration of a program for the “Corporate Social Responsibility” course, its objectives, tasks and specific features of teaching at different level



programs (bachelor programs, master programs, Master of Business Administration). The workshop was moderated by Yuriy Blagov, the Director of the CSR Center at the Graduate School of Management of the St. Petersburg State University.

BEST PRACTICES FROM GC MEMBERS

Master-class for journalists «Why CSR is a Useful and Interesting Topic»

In 2009 the Ukrainian Association of Press Publishers (UAPP) with support of the Coca-Cola Beverages Ukraine organized a second module of the University of Journalists' Excellency that was dedicated to social responsibility in business. The Global Compact Secretariat was invited to conduct a master class entitled "Business and Society. Why CSR is an interesting and useful topic". During the workshop, the participants had to find ideas for interesting materials on CSR on the basis of social reports of the GC Network members. The interactive and practical focus of the master class favored a broad discussion and was highly appreciated by journalists.

Contest for journalists on the best analytical material on CSR in Ukraine

The contest was initiated by the GC Network with the aim to improve the coverage of corporate social responsibility in the Ukrainian mass media and to raise awareness on corporate citizenship within broad segments of the society. The contest lasted for five months and more than forty works from the 21 journalists were submitted. Ms. Olena Gladskih from "Delo" newspaper won the main prize – participation in the annual Forum of Global Compact Network that was held in June in Istanbul, Turkey. Additionally, the Coca-Cola Company awarded Mr. Sviatoslav Rybnikov, a journalist of "Ukrainian Technical Newspaper" for popularizing CSR in the regions. Ms. Viktoriya Granina who represented the "Gvardiya" project won in the nomination of Phillips Ukraine "Energy Efficiency – a Prerequisite for Human Welfare". ●



PARTNERSHIP PROJECTS

Global Compact encourages members of the GC Network to implement long-term, large-scale projects in cooperation with the UN agencies and civil society organizations to support the Global Millennium Development Goals. Since the establishment of Global Compact Network in Ukraine, five projects have been already in progress. Two more projects were launched in 2009.

“Mobile Healthcare”: partnership between MTS-Ukraine and Ministry of Health of Ukraine

By initiative and mediation of GC Network in Ukraine, a GC member MTS-Ukraine signed the Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of Health of Ukraine on the development of telemedical network. The task of a pilot project “Mobile Healthcare” is to create a pilot telemedical network that will unite four nodes: the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, the Scientific and Practical Center of Telemedicine in Kiyv, Donetsk and Zakarpattia oblast hospitals. The spreading of the acquired experience across all Ukraine’s territory on the level of oblast hospitals will be the next step. The project is a first real step towards the creation of a network of the medical institutions using telecommunication technologies for the provision of timely and high-quality medical assistance for patients living in oblast centers or travelling for consultation from remote regions of Ukraine.

“Every drop matters”: partnership between UNDP and Coca-Cola

«Every drop matters!» is an all-Ukrainian joint program of the UNDP and the “Coca-Cola” company BonAqua brand. The objective is to restore and protect natural springs, to support proper management of water resources and to create rehabilitation zones around them. Project strategy relies on active involvement of local community, with particular emphasis on school-age children to bring up environmental awareness in the younger generation of



Ukrainian people. Based upon the results of the all-Ukrainian competition, 15 springs in 12 regions of Ukraine were selected and restored in 2009. The Advisory Committee decided to continue the support for the project «Every drop matters» in 2010. ●

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Regional meeting of Global Compact networks of Ukraine, Moldova and Belarus (20 May)



In May 2009, Global Compact Network welcomed at its regular meeting the delegations from Belarus and Moldova. Participants from the three countries discussed the features of networks in the region and shared the experience of partnership projects in their countries. GC Regional network meeting was ended by joint third anniversary celebration of the Global Compact initiative in the region.

Global Compact Annual Local Network Forum (ALNF) in Istanbul, Turkey (8-11 June)

The Ukrainian delegation included Mr. Mendoza-Wilson, the Head of the GC Steering Committee (System Capital Management), Ms. Marina Saprykina, Director of the CSR Development Center, and representatives from the Secretariat of the Global Compact: Ms. Yuliya Shcherbinina and Anna Danylyuk. More than 300 participants from 80 local networks participated in the Forum. The Ukrainian delegation

presented the unique experience of implementing multi-stakeholder national campaign GO GREEN!

CSR National conference in Tbilisi, Georgia (10 July)

The conference was organized by the GC Network in Georgia with the support of ten business associations and non-governmental organizations. Invited by the GC Network in Georgia, Jock Mendoza-Wilson, the Director on International and Investor Relations of the "SCM" Company, the Head of the GC Steering Committee in Ukraine, was a speaker at the conference sharing achievements of the Ukrainian GC Network and the experience in the implementation of the GC principles at SCM.

CSR International Conference in Erivan, Armenia (22-23 October)

A two-day CSR conference was held within the framework of Arevordi Festival and was organized by the Fund for Wildlife Protection and Culture in the Republic of Armenia (FPWC) and the company VivaCell-MTS, in cooperation with GTZ and GC Network in Armenia. The main discussion topic was the role of CSR in the solution of Armenia's ecological problems. The conference was attended by the Minister of Economy of Armenia, Mr. Nerses Eritsian, and representatives from business and academic circles. GC Network in Armenia invited Mr. Vasyl Arbuzov, Head of Department on Corporate Communications of the Industrial Union of Donnbas Corporation, to share his company's experience in implementing CSR practices aiming at reduction negative impact of production on environment.

CSR International Forum in Sofia, Bulgaria (17 November)

The event was organized by GC Network in Bulgaria, the Bulgarian Confederation of Employers and Entrepreneurs and the "Tulip Foundation". The special guest of the Forum was the Head of the GC Steering Committee in Ukraine, Mr. Mendoza-Wilson (SCM Company). ●
